"The weather was great. It didn't bother me, I thought it would be a little hotter," he said.

While Wiberg and Koenig were each having good days racing through the quarter-mile swim, 15-mile bike ride and 3mile run, so was Kathleen Walsh.

Walsh, 26, of Rockford, Ill. won the overall female race in 1:08:33. Walsh edged out Susan Epperson, 30, also of Rockford, by more than a minute for the overall title. Walsh competed in the first heat while Epperson was in the 11th.

Epperson finished first in the female age 30 to 35 division while Walsh won the age 25 to 29 division.

About 45 people did not show for the triathlon, which lowered the total from the capacity 475 people who registered for the YMCA's largest event of the year.


People participated for trophies in seven different male age divisions and six female divisions.
